First Record of *Creophilus flavipennis* (HOPE) from Japan (Coleoptera, Staphylinidae)

Creophilus flavipennis (HOPE) (Japanese name: Minamiô-hanekakushi) (Fig. 1) is widely distributed in India, through Southeast Asia to New Guinea (CLARKE, 2011), but it has not been recorded from East Asia including Japan. This is the first record of the species from East Asia.
